ABSTRACT

In recent years, Twak Vikara (Skin disorders) have become increasingly common among the People. The rise in dermatological issues is particularly noticeable in tropical regions and developing countries like India. This increase can be attributed to a variety of factors, such as poor environmental hygiene, inadequate sanitation, illiteracy, and improper skincare practices. People suffering from skin diseases often face physical discomfort, emotional distress, and social stigma due to their appearance, which can lead to socio-economic challenges. One prevalent skin condition is Dadru Kushtha (Dermatophytosis) characterized by persistent Kandu (Itching), Raga (Erythema), Pidika (Eruptions) and Udgata Mandala (Elevated circular skin lesion), Srava (Ozing). It is classified as a disease primarily caused by an imbalance in Kapha and Pitta. While Acharya Charaka categorized Dadru under Kshudra Kushtha (Minor skin diseases), Acharya Sushruta and Acharya Vagbhatta placed it among Mahakushtha (Major skin diseases). As Acharya Sushruta mentioned Kushtha as upasargaja roga and Charak told as Kushtha roga occur by three different krimi that are Kothaja, Kledaja, Swedaja krimi. As per modern perspective disease Dadru Kushtha, comes under Dermatophytosis (Superficial fungal infection of skin). It is a Sweadaja krimi due to Sweda Atisrava, improper sanitization, this leads to Swedaja krimi. Dadru may include due to vitiation of swedaja krimi manifest Dadru kushtha as indirectly mentioned in Charak Samhita.

INTRODUCTION

Ayurveda is a science which is helpful for both the world Earth and Paradise. Ayurveda is an Appendage of Atharvaveda, that is the aftermost Veda among the four Vedas. The regimen through people can spend a healthy long life, and all kinds of methods of treatment as well as the remedies are vividly described in the texts of Ayurveda in a systematic and scientific manner. Skin is a mirror that reflects external and internal pathology there by helps in diagnosis of disease. It is first organ of the body interacting with stimuli and natural ability of body, Skin disease accounts for prevalence rate 10-20% of all consultation in general practice

Skin is the largest organ of human body. It's size and external location makes it susceptible to a wide variety of disorders. Skin Disease are being considered as a major health problem in children. In Recent years, there has been a considerable increase in incidence of skin problems in the tropical and developing countries like India due to various reasons like poverty, poor sanitation unhygienic, pollution etc¹

All the skin Diseases in Ayurveda have been classified under the broad heading of Kushtha. Which are further categorized in to Maha Kushtha and Kshudra kushtha. Dadru kushtha is a type of

Kushtha that comes under both due to it's quick invading Nature. In broad sense Kushtha is the one which causes vitiation as well as discoloration of the skin. Acharya Charaka has described Dadru as a Kshudra Kushtha. As per it's definition the reddish coloured Pidika in the form of Mandala with elevated borders and Itching is known as Dadru.²

Dadru being one among Kushtha is also a Rasa, Rakta and Mamsadhatupradoshaja Vikara.³

It is usually caused by nidana divided under three major classification i.e. aharaja, viharaja and Krimija. Here krimi can be considered for the related (swedaja) fungi which are dermatophytes capable of causing skin changes of the type known as Ringworm infection or Dermatophytosis.⁴

On the basis of presenting Symptomatology Dadru with Dermatophytosis through Modern perspective it come under superficial fungal Infection of the skin the most common dermatological manifestation affecting up to 15% of world's population in all group.⁵



METHOD

1. To study the literature review of Dadru Khustha through Ayurveda.
2. It would have analyzed the etiological factors (Nidana), pathogenesis (Samprapti), symptoms (Lakshana) and management approaches (Shodhana, Shamana, Lepa) described in Ayurveda.

LITERATURE REVIEW

Ayurvedic review of Dadru Kushta (Dermatophytosis)

Skin diseases have been comprehended under the heading of *Kushta* in *Ayurveda*. and We find a vivid Description of *Dadru*. since *Samhita* period only *Acharya Charaka* has mentioned 18 types of *kushta* which are further subdivided into *Mahakushta* and *Kshudra kushta* *Dadru Kushta* has been Mentioned only in *Chikitsa sthana*.⁶

Acharya Susruta has mentioned tThe study would also summarize the modern medical perspective on Tinea infections that *Dadru Kushta* occur due to *Kapha Dosha*. He further has explained about the lakshanas of *Dadru* like *Tamra varna*, *Atasipushpa varna*. *Vridha Vagbhata* has mentioned 18 type of *Kushta* as usual and also mentions that *Dadru* is *Kapha Pitta* Type of *Kushta*.⁷

Laghu Vagbhata has followed the same classification as that of *Susrutha*. He has mentioned *Kandu* as the symptoms of *Dadru*. *Dadru* is Caused due to *Kapha Pitta* Predominance.⁸

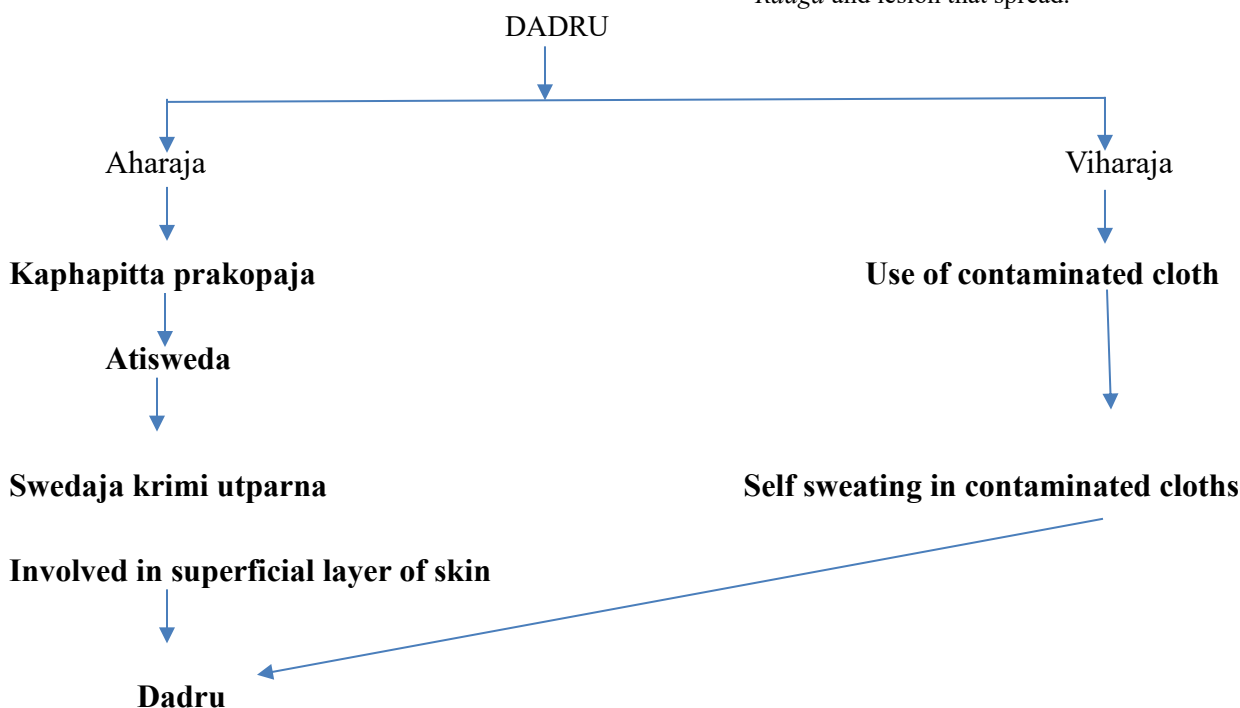
Bhela Samhita has mentioned about 18 type of *Kushta*. *Kushta* has been mentioned in *Nidaan sthana* and *Chikitsa sthana*.⁹ Separate nidanas, poorvarooopa and samprapti, for *Dadru Kushta* or even other kinds of *kushta* have not been enlisted. The *Samanaya nidaan* of *Kushta* has to be taken as *hetu* for *Dadru* also.

Etiology (Nidana)

According to *Ayurveda*, *Dadru Kushta* is not assigned specific cause but is said to spread from one person to another through *Malaja krimi* (microorganisms) transmitted via *Sweda* (Sweat). This transmission occurs through direct contact with infected individuals by sharing items like towels, bed sheets, soap used by the infected person. This sharing facilitates the spread of fungal spores from one individuals to another.¹⁰

Samprapti :

Dadru kushta is contagious (*Aupasargika Vyadhi*) & spreads through shared person items such as clothes, soap, bed sheets leading to the transmission of microorganisms from one person to another (*Bahya malaja krimi*). These organisms enter the *Twak* via *Sweda* and disturb the balance of the tridosha along with *Twak*, *Rakta*, *lasika*. The symptoms include *Kandu*, *Pidika*, *Raaga* and lesion that spread.¹¹

PURVARUPA

Ayurvedic classics have not described *Purvarupa* of *Dadru Kushta*, still the *Purva Rupa* of *Kushta* can be considered as the *Poorvaroopta* of *Dadru Kushta*. *Poorvaroopta* of *Kushta* in general is considered as mentioned in different texts. No any sensation, excessive sweating or no sweating, discoloration on affected side, itching, wound healing time to be longer, excessive pain, burning sensation.¹²

Dadru is characterized by *Kandu* (itching), *Raga* (redness), *Pidika* (macule/papule), *Utsannamandala*, *Rukshyata* (dryness), *Daha* (burning sensation). It is the glabrous skin present as circumscribed lesion with a wide variety of appearance including scales, vesicles, pustules.¹³

MANAGEMENT

Given today's lifestyle and increasing resistance of the human body, *Ayurveda* needs to be emphasized for addressing these resistance patterns that could be harmful in the future. Therefore, *Ayurvedic* formulation like *Bahimarjana* (External application) in the form of *Lepas*, along with *samana aushadhis*, should be used. These remedies act as localized treatments externally and also purify the blood internally, helping to eradicate diseases at their root. These *Ayurvedic* formulations have the ability to completely cure *Dadru*, with recurrence chance minimal due to the unique properties of the herbs involved.

OBSERVATION AND RESULT

It occurs due to different factors (*Nidanans*) that disturb *Tridosha*. The main symptoms include itching (*Kandu*), circular patches (*Mandalas*), redness (*Raga*), and small eruptions (*Pidakas*). These features closely resemble the symptoms of *Tinea* (ringworm) in modern medicine, such as round itchy patches, redness, and pustules.

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
