This initiative provides free travel on government-run buses across the state, with the issuance of smart cards to beneficiaries. The scheme, one of the government's poll guarantees, is expected to benefit over 41.8 lakh women passengers daily, albeit at an estimated annual cost of Rs. 4,051.56 crore to the state exchequer. The scheme, officially launched in June 11, 2023, extends its benefits to women of all ages and includes transgender individuals. Efforts to streamline travel through the development of smart cards are underway, with interim access provided through zero-sum tickets. Beyond providing free bus travel, the 'Shakti' scheme aims to enhance women's access to education, employment, healthcare, and other essential services. It signifies a crucial step forward in advancing women's empowerment and societal inclusion within Karnataka.

REVIEW OF LITERATURE

1. **Uday et al. (5 June 2023)** discussed the implementation of the Shakti scheme by the Karnataka government, heralding free bus travel for women across state-run buses, effective June 11. The government's directive mandates a 50% seat reservation for men, ensuring equitable access to transportation services. Application for

the Shakti Smart Card is facilitated through the Seva Sindhu portal, emphasizing accessibility and ease of enrollment.

2. **Hindustan Times (7 June 2023)** analyzed the unveiling of the 'Shakti Yojane' scheme by the Karnataka government, marking a significant stride towards gender equality by offering free bus travel for women across the state. Launched at Bengaluru's Vidhana Soudha, the initiative fulfills one of Congress' electoral pledges and prioritizes enhancing women's convenience and accessibility to transportation services. Minister of Transport emphasis on augmenting bus services underscores the government's commitment to addressing transportation disparities. The introduction of Shakti smart cards and their impending necessity illustrate the government's strategy to streamline the scheme's implementation while ensuring eligibility and accountability.

3. **Arora, Sumit (9 June 2023)** highlighted the Karnataka government's advisory, encouraging women to seize the opportunity of free bus travel by acquiring Shakti smart cards, available from June 11 through the designated government portal. With specific guidelines in place, the scheme caters exclusively to ordinary state-run bus services within Karnataka, excluding certain premium categories. Reservation of 50% seats for men on designated buses underscores the government's commitment to inclusive transportation policies.

4. **The Financial Express (19 June 2023)** focused on the Karnataka government's Shakti scheme, designed to empower women and transgender individuals through free bus travel, which has elicited varied online responses. Despite concerns about fiscal implications and logistical challenges, the scheme has catalyzed a notable increase in female ridership, exemplifying its positive societal impact.



The mandatory requirement of Shakti Smart Cards, coupled with a streamlined application process, reflects the government's commitment to ensuring equitable access to transportation services.

5. **B.P., Darshan Devaiah (11 August 2023)** analyzed the Shakti scheme's transition to issuing regular passes, following the Center for e-Governance's refusal to develop smart cards, highlighting operational adaptability amid challenges. Despite procedural adjustments, the scheme continues to resonate positively with female passengers, facilitating significant ridership and financial savings. Minister of Transport directive to utilize existing pass issuance systems underscores the government's responsiveness to implementation hurdles, ensuring continued service provision to beneficiaries.

6. **Blog.Jagokisan.Com (24 October 2023)** showcased the integration of the Seva Sindhu portal, enabling seamless application for Shakti smart cards, further enhancing accessibility and enrollment. Provisions for seat reservations and forthcoming reimbursement mechanisms reflect the government's proactive approach to addressing gender disparities in transportation. The convergence of state road transport corporations in implementing the scheme underscores a unified effort to promote women's mobility and empowerment.

7. **Outlook India (18 January 2024)** discussed the multifaceted challenges presented by the rollout of the Shakti Scheme in Karnataka since its inception on June 11, 2023. The surge in passengers availing free travel has strained bus operators and conductors, leading to operational difficulties and overcrowding. Particularly in Bengaluru, students face commuting woes amidst the burgeoning ridership. Overcrowding exacerbates concerns of harassment and discomfort for women passengers, underscoring the need for sustainable solutions to ensure the scheme's efficacy in promoting gender equality.

8. **Pavan Agrawal (29 February 2024)** explained the Karnataka Shakti Scheme, spearheaded by author, aiming to provide women in the state with free bus transportation to foster gender equality. The innovative Shakti Smart Card facilitates various transportation options, alleviating the financial burden on women and promoting their mobility. The scheme's details elucidate the process for women to obtain the Shakti Smart Card and capitalize on this progressive initiative.

9. **Shahrukh (2024)** discussed the Karnataka Shakti Scheme, the flagship initiative of the Government of Karnataka, aiming to bolster women's financial empowerment through complimentary bus services. Mandating the use of Smart Cards underscores the scheme's operational efficiency and accountability, aligning with its core objective of fostering women's economic autonomy.

10. **Arvind (4 April 2024)** analyzed the formal launch of the Karnataka Shakti Scheme, underscoring the government's commitment to advancing women's financial empowerment through complimentary bus services. While limitations on

eligible buses and travel boundaries exist, the scheme's simplicity and accessibility through the Seva Sindhu portal signify a concerted effort to facilitate widespread participation. Notably, the scheme's projected beneficiaries and anticipated benefits underscore its potential to catalyze social and economic transformation for women across Karnataka.

Allowed and Not Allowed Buses for Travel under Scheme

The Scheme provides free travel for eligible women on government-run buses within Karnataka. This applies to most, but not all, categories of buses operated by the Karnataka State Road Transport Corporation (KSRTC). Here is a breakdown of the allowed buses under the scheme:

Included Buses

- **City Buses:** These are buses that operate within city limits, typically connecting major points and localities.
- **Ordinary Buses:** These are standard intercity buses that provide connectivity between towns and cities across Karnataka. They offer basic amenities and make designated stops along the route.
- **Express Buses:** These are faster intercity buses with fewer stops compared to ordinary buses. They often connect major cities and may offer slightly better amenities.



Excluded Buses

The Scheme excludes travel on premium buses operated by the Karnataka State Road Transport Corporation (KSRTC). These buses typically offer a more luxurious travel experience with features like air-conditioning, comfortable seating, and sometimes even entertainment systems. Here is a more specific list of buses you likely cannot use the scheme on:

- **Non-AC Sleeper:** These buses offer reclining seats that convert into beds for overnight travel, but lack air-conditioning.
- **AC Sleeper:** Sleeper buses with air-conditioning for a more comfortable overnight journey.
- **Rajahansa:** These buses are comfortable and affordable options for intercity travel. They have standard amenities such as comfortable seating and air conditioning.
- **Vajra, Vayu Vajra:** KSRTC's brand names for high-speed luxury buses offering a premium travel experience.
- **Airavat:** Another brand name for KSRTC's premium category buses with AC and potentially more amenities. This includes subcategories like:
 - Airavat Club Class
 - Airavat Gold Class
- **Ambari:** Yet another brand for KSRTC's premium bus category, often with AC and additional features. This includes subcategories like:
 - Ambari Dream Class
 - Ambari Utsav Fly Bus
- **EV Power Plus:** While electric, this bus falls under the premium category due to its potential for additional features and amenities.

Eligibility Criteria for the Scheme

The eligibility criteria for the Scheme are as follows:

Residence: Applicants must be residents of Karnataka state. This ensures that the benefits of the scheme are targeted towards individuals domiciled within Karnataka.

Age: There is no specified minimum or maximum age limit. Women of all ages residing in Karnataka are eligible to apply for the scheme.

Employment: Employees of the Karnataka State Road Transport Corporation (KSRTC) are not eligible for the scheme. This exclusion is to prevent duplication of benefits as KSRTC employees may already have access to subsidized travel benefits through their employment.

Gender Identity: The scheme is open to all women and transgender individuals who consider Karnataka their home state. This inclusive approach ensures that individuals of various gender identities residing in Karnataka can benefit from the scheme.

It's important to note that eligible applicants must apply for a Shakti Smart Card to access the free bus rides provided by the scheme. However, since the smart card system is still under

development, interim measures such as zero-fare tickets are available for eligible individuals to enjoy free bus travel within Karnataka until the smart cards are issued.

Documents Required for Scheme

The documents required for applying to the Karnataka Shakti Scheme are as follows:

Proof of Identity: Any government-issued ID card with a photograph and name, such as:

- Aadhaar card
- Voter ID card
- Driving License
- Passport
- Pan card

Proof of Residence: A document verifying the applicant's address in Karnataka, which can be:

- Aadhaar card (if it contains the address)
- Voter ID card
- Ration card
- Passport

Any other government-issued document showing the Karnataka address

Recent Passport-sized Photograph: A digital copy of the applicant's recent passport-sized photograph is likely required for the online application process.

Procedure to Apply for the Shakti Smart Card

2. **Login:** Once registered, log in to the portal using your credentials.
3. **Apply for Smart Card:** Look for the option to "Apply for Shakti Smart Card" or similar wording. This might be under a dedicated "Shakti Scheme" section.
4. **Application Form:** The portal will provide an online application form. Fill out the form carefully with your personal details.
5. **Documents:** During the application process, you will typically need to provide proof of identity (such as Aadhaar card, Voter ID, etc.), proof of residence (like Aadhaar card with address, ration card, etc.), and a recent passport-sized photograph. These documents may need to be scanned and uploaded as part of the application process, including address proof and photo identification.
6. **Submission:** After completing the form and uploading documents, submit the application electronically.
7. **Verification and Issuance:** The authorities will verify your application. Once approved, you will receive your Shakti Smart Card.

The Karnataka Shakti Scheme has primarily impacted private bus operators, but it could also have indirect effects on auto rickshaws, cabs, and car operators:

Impact on Private Bus Operators:

- **Negative Impact:** This has been the most significant effect. Free bus travel for women has led to a decrease in ridership on private buses, resulting in:
 - **Loss of Revenue:** News reports suggest drops in business by as much as 60%.
 - **Financial Strain:** This can affect the financial health of private bus companies and potentially lead to job losses for drivers and staff.
 - **Protests:** Private operators have demanded compensation from the government and threatened strikes to address their concerns.
