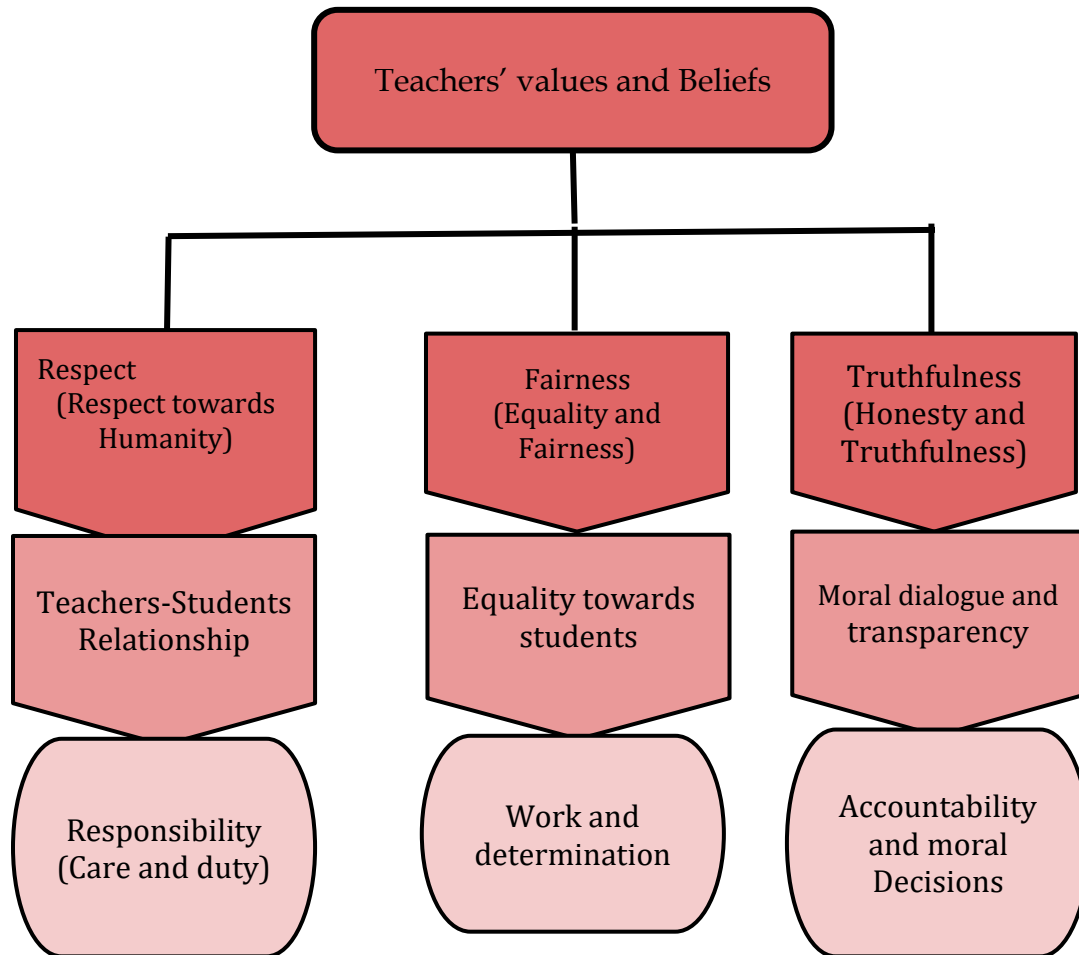


Figure 1: Values and Beliefs of a Teacher (Source: Authors' Creation)
