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## ABSTRACT

The study was conducted using a survey method with the help of a structured questionnaire distributed among employees. A total of 110 respondents were selected through random sampling techniques. Both primary and secondary data were used for the research. The collected data were analyzed using statistical tools such as Chi-Square test, Correlation analysis, and percentage analysis.*

*The study reveals that employee motivation plays a vital role in improving productivity, teamwork, organizational commitment, and employee morale. Financial incentives, promotions, salary increments, training programs, recognition, and supportive working conditions are major motivating factors for employees. Most employees expressed satisfaction regarding HR support, organizational culture, and job security. The findings also indicate that employees prefer financial incentives over non-financial incentives. The study concludes that organizations should continuously improve motivational practices to maintain employee satisfaction and achieve organizational success. Effective motivation strategies help organizations reduce employee turnover, improve work efficiency, and create a positive work environment.*

The analysis of demographic data reveals that most employees belong to the younger age group. About 41% of respondents are below 30 years and another 41% belong to the age group of 31–40 years. The majority of respondents are male employees. Most employees possess HSC and PG educational qualifications.

The study indicates that employees are generally satisfied with organizational motivation practices. Around 60% of employees agree that top management is interested in motivating employees. Employees also expressed satisfaction regarding HR support, job security, working culture, and training programs.

Financial incentives were identified as the most preferred motivational factor. A majority of employees believe that salary increments, promotions, and incentives improve their performance and satisfaction. Employees also stated that proper working conditions, lunch breaks, leave facilities, and supportive organizational culture positively influence their motivation levels.

The Chi-Square analysis showed a significant difference in employee opinions regarding management's interest in employee motivation. Correlation analysis revealed a negative relationship between years of experience and number of employees, indicating that the organization has a larger number of employees with lower experience levels.

### **FINDINGS**

The study identified several important findings regarding employee motivation in TNPL. Most employees are satisfied with the support provided by the HR department and organizational management. Financial incentives are considered more effective than non-financial incentives in motivating employees. Promotions and salary increases are the major factors motivating employees to perform better.

Employees are satisfied with job security, working conditions, organizational culture, and training programs. The majority of employees believe that management is genuinely interested in motivating employees and maintaining a positive work environment. Employees also expressed confidence regarding future organizational changes and development initiatives.

The research findings indicate that effective employee motivation practices improve productivity, teamwork, employee morale, and organizational commitment. Proper motivational strategies help organizations maintain employee satisfaction and reduce turnover.

### **SUGGESTIONS**

HR policies should be employee-friendly and designed to address employee concerns effectively. The organization should continuously review motivational practices and implement improvements based on employee feedback.
